

# ◆◆◆ EMERGENCY SUPPLIES CHECKLIST ◆◆◆

**Home Kit:** Put 3 days supplies in a very sturdy plastic garbage can or other plastic container with a tight lid.

**Go Bag:** Put 3 days supply of personal items you'll want to take to a shelter, friend's house, or motel into a small backpack and put it under your bed to grab if you must evacuate.

**Car Go Bag:** Put a smaller version of your Home Kit in your trunk so you can live out of your car for 3 days.

**Put a ✓ check mark by the things you need for each kit. When you've gathered them, give yourself another checkmark. ✓✓**

			Two weeks supply of prescription and non-prescription medications
			My Emergency Information and My Plan to Stay at Home
			Extra set of glasses and sunglasses
			Photos of family members
			Copies of important papers such as drivers license, insurance policies, & prescriptions
			Extra set of car and house keys
			First aid kit
			Blankets or sleeping bag
			Flashlight with batteries stored separately
			Light sticks
			Whistle or other signaling device (air horn, beeper, bell, or screecher) you can use to draw attention to you if you need emergency assistance to alert people you need help
			Portable radio (battery, solar, or crank)
			Extra batteries for flashlights, radio, & disability-related devices
			Money (at least \$50) in bills, quarters for the phone, credit card

			Sturdy work gloves To protect your hands from sharp objects you may try to lift or touch by mistake while walking or wheeling over glass and rubble
			Dust mask
			Full change of clothing for the season including underwear, spare jacket, extra pair of sturdy shoes, jacket, hat, rain poncho
			Personal items
			Bowel & bladder care, inc. ostomy
			Sanitary items, i.e. toilet paper, moist towelettes or hand sanitizer, feminine supplies, soap, toothpaste and brush
			Pet supplies
			Map with evacuation routes marked
			Notepad and pencil, book
			Multipurpose tool or gas wrench, screwdriver, hammer, pliers, knife, duct tape
			Trash bags, ziplock bags for storing food and waste
			Charged cell phone
			Books, playing cards, crossword, games
