SCAMC Educational Workshops and Academies



The Sonoma County Administrative Management Council (SCAMC) is comprised of managers with the County of Sonoma who are in positions designated as administrative management but excluding the Board of Supervisors, County Administrator, Director of Human Resources, County Counsel and elected County officials. Those who are qualified may join SCAMC for a one-time fee. Membership continues as long as the member is an active administrative manager with the County of Sonoma. The purpose of SCAMC is:

- To promote high standards of management practices and conduct among its members and to promote the advancement of programs and policies that will enhance and improve the quality and delivery of needed services to the citizens of Sonoma County.
- To present to its members relevant data pertaining to salaries, hours of employment, fringe benefits, grievances, working conditions and all other conditions of employment.
- To sponsor and encourage activities tending to improve the morale and contributing to the general welfare of SCAMC members and the service in which they are employed.

To this end, SCAMC sponsors a number of educational workshops throughout the year, including an annual Spring and Fall Breakfast and the Executive Development, Management and Supervisory Academies.
